<u>NOTE</u>: All observation/evaluation forms (rubrics) and other required reports are included in a binder provided by the Office of Clinical Practice. Due dates are indicated. "Observations and Evaluations" binders will be checked by the university supervisor for completion at each on-site visit. The completed binder will be returned to the Director of Student Teaching at the end of the semester.

The *school-based supervising teacher* will complete six (6) <u>FORMAL</u> lesson evaluations <u>and</u> will complete the following reports:

- A formative Dispositions Report at the end of 5 weeks
- A formative Dispositions Report at the end of 10 weeks
- A summative Final (overall) Evaluation

The summative Final Evaluation takes into consideration the entire semester of teaching, observing, and participating by the student teacher. The 3 persons involved (supervising teacher, university supervisor, and student teacher) will <u>EACH</u> complete a <u>SEPARATE</u> Final Evaluation form <u>PRIOR TO</u> the collaborative conference. The collaborative conference will include a review of the final evaluation prepared by each participant in order to arrive at a consensus for the completion of the <u>OFFICIAL</u> Final Evaluation and will also include the student teacher's "Action Plan for Future Growth".

<u>NOTE</u>: The required lessons do not have to be taught and evaluated in any particular order.

Please note that the university supervisor will evaluate the mathematics lesson and the technologyintegrated lesson.

<u>PLEASE NOTE</u>: The school-based supervising teacher will complete a "<u>hard copy</u>" of the 3 reports bulleted above to be given to the student teacher for submission to the Director of Clinical Practice on specified due dates.

The *university supervisor* will complete the following **FORMAL** evaluations/assessments:

- A Mathematics Lesson
- A formative Midsemester Assessment
- A Technology-integrated Lesson
- A summative Final (overall) Evaluation

In addition, the university supervisor will make a "get acquainted" visit early in the semester and 'additional visits' will be made as needed.

- A Technology-integrated Lesson
- A formative Midsemester Assessment
- A summative Final (overall) Evaluation

Additionally, the **university supervisor** will complete an NCSS Addendum to <u>ONE</u> (1) of the lesson evaluations and make a "get acquainted" visit early in the semester. At least one additional observation will be made. 'Additional visits' will be made as needed.

A *university* <u>content mentor</u> will complete an observation evaluation for at least one (1) of the required lessons listed above, *along with* <u>ONE</u> NCSS Addendum for the lesson observed.
