1.	The incorporation of cultural pluralism as part of the underly- ing foundation or basic framework for the District, including subject-matter content, teaching and learning strategies, goals and objectives, classroom climates, and assessment of the performances of students and teachers.	
2.	The equal-status treatment of the life experiences, cultures, and perspectives of culturally diverse groups.	
3.	The integration of principles of cultural pluralism into all decisions about curriculum and instruction.	
4.	The development of alternative structures that reflect cultural, racial, social, gender, and ethnic pluralism.	
5.	A program of learning opportunities that gives balanced atten- tion to practices to celebrate cultural pluralism.	
6.	District governance representation in state level textbook or other curriculum forums.	
The District's curriculum shall provide a knowledge base that re- flects the achievement of all cultural and ethnic groups, and pro- vide a more accurate base of information through the inclusion of diverse historical figures and perspectives. Materials developed shall address each instructional area—reading, language arts, ma- thematics, social studies, science/health, physical education, fine arts—in terms of program philosophy, goals, student activities, modes of learning, grouping for instruction, and assessment prac- tices.		
Criteria for selection of instructional materials other than textbooks are set for the District in each discipline. They are provided to each campus annually.
